Target Audience

The target audience is this is focused on precepting within pharmacy residency training programs. Could be relevant to other providers who precept and likely have similar issues.

Activity Overview

Mental health issues will be more prevalent than within millennials. This session will prepare participants to understand what this generation may mean for their workplaces, provide motivation to take steps to address resident wellness, and train skills for addressing mental health concerns. Rates of burnout within pharmacy continue to rise which will make this challenging situation even more confounding for health systems. Within the application portion, we will utilize deidentified real cases of resident mental illness and burnout that the speakers have navigated at their institution. The audience will be asked to then work through these cases in a think-pair-share activity.

- Distinguish burnout from depression.
- Outline a plan for a staff wellness program
