Target Audience

This webinar will provide an overview on healthcare workforce burnout, well-being and resilience and offer a glimpse at the leadership and resources offered by the National Academy of Medicine (NAM) Action Collaborative on Clinician Well-Being and Resilience and by ASHP. Information is relevant to all audiences, with examples for how students and student societies of health-system pharmacy (SSHP) can be involved in this work.

Activity Overview

The healthcare workforce is reporting alarming rates of depression, post-traumatic stress disorder, and poor work-life balance leading to clinician burnout. At the individual clinician level, it presents as emotional exhaustion, depersonalization, and a low sense of accomplishment. At the healthcare system level, it is associated with medical errors and loss of productivity. This presentation will frame the problem of burnout as both a patient care and healthcare workforce problem, introduce attendees to the National Academy of Medicine (NAM) Action Collaborative on Clinician Well-Being and Resilience, and identify strategies for advancing pharmacy workforce well-being and resilience. ASHP is an original sponsor of this Action Collaborative and working to identify mechanisms that support and ensure a thriving and stable pharmacy workforce.
